INTRODUCTION

These By-Laws, prepared in accordance with the Rosnay Golf Club Limited (*the Club*) Constitution (*the Constitution*) as approved and or as amended from time to time, are binding upon all Members of the Club.

1 GOLF OPERATIONS

1.1 CLUB CAPTAIN

The Club Captain is responsible for the organisation of play on the golf course and should be selected for their qualities of leadership and ability to uphold the rules and traditions of the game. The Captain is responsible for enforcing and implementing all rules, policies and procedures regarding golf within the club. The responsibilities of the position includes:

1. Match Committee – chairperson of the Committee.
2. Finance – oversee the development, completion and implementation of the annual budget for golf. Ensure the best possible financial performance by monitoring daily golf operations and the total revenues and expenses.
3. Sponsorship – develop and implement a sponsorship program for Major Events, Corporate Golf and the introduction of a Rosnay Corporate Sponsor.
4. Junior Development – develop, formulate and implement a junior programme.
5. Golfing Calendar – develop the golfing calendar.
6. Major Events – oversee all Major Events conducted by the club.
7. Local Rules – ongoing development, changes and implementation.
8. Rules of Golf and Etiquette.
9. Selection of club representative teams.
10. By-Laws – continued development of Golf By-Laws.
11. Golf NSW Delegate.
12. Ensure that all golf related emails in the golf@rosnaysgolfclub.com.au mailbox are actioned promptly.

1.2 MATCH COMMITTEE

The Match Committee will comprise of Full Playing Financial Members, aged over 18 years who are affiliated with Golf Australia. The committee will be responsible for the organisation, promotion and control for both men's and ladies golf competitions within the club in accordance with the R&A Rules of Golf and within the guidelines set down by Golf Australia and its State Associations.

1.3 MATCH COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

The Match Committee will be chaired by the Club Captain, elected by the members at the club's AGM. The committee will include male and female members, and Handicappers. The listing of all Match Committee Members and Handicappers must be submitted to the Board on an annual basis prior to the AGM.

1.4 MATCH COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITIES

1. The Match Committee is responsible for the control and management of all aspects of the playing of men's and ladies golf on the course. The Match Committee shall:
2. Acquire a good working knowledge of the Rules of Golf including obtaining their Rules Accreditation Qualifications.
3. Acquire a thorough understanding of the Australian Handicap System and Course Rating System recognized by Golf Australia.
4. Assist with the preparation and formation of the golfing programme along with other information.
5. Determine and clearly display in advance the conditions under which men's and ladies competitions are to be played.
6. Deal with and resolve disputes arising from the conduct of matches and competitions. It is essential that committee members are thoroughly conversant with and have immediate access to the Conditions of the Competition, current Local Rules, Rules of Golf and Decisions on the Rules of Golf.
7. Allocate all trophies and prizes other than those, which have been donated for specific events.
8. Select individuals and/or teams to represent the club as and when required, and to appoint a team manager.
9. Ensure that information and performances, regarding talented players are put forward to enable those players to be considered for selection in various representative teams.
10. Ensure that all local rules on the scorecard are relevant and accurate.
11. Make or vary any temporary Local Rules displayed on the Temporary Local Rules Board as may from time to time be deemed necessary, and in particular on those occasions when advised by the Course Superintendent. All Local Rules and Temporary Local Rules should be worded in accordance with the specimen Local Rules provided in the Rules of Golf by Golf Australia or State Associations.
12. Ensure that a Committee representative is available at all times during a competition to make decisions and suspend or cancel play if required.
13. Handicappers shall allot handicaps to new members in accordance with the Australian Handicapping System.
14. Educate members as necessary in the proper playing of the game.
15. Monitor play on the course, so as to reduce undue delay to the minimum level.
16. Develop, formulate and implement a "Charter of Conditions" for all events played by the club, especially player eligibility and conditions for all Club Championships and Medal Competitions.

1.5 MATCH COMMITTEE MEETINGS

1. The Match Committee will meet monthly to discuss all matters pertaining to male and female competitions conducted by the Club and make recommendations to the Board of Directors on golf related issues.
2. The committee shall meet at 6pm or at such other time on a date as determined by the Captain, provided that at least one meeting is held per month before each scheduled Board of Directors meeting.

2 COMPETITIONS

The Match Committee is at all times required to operate within the confines set out in the document "Competition Administration & Competition Conditions – Golf Australia Recommendations" and as updated.

Golf is a game of honour and each competitor holds a position of trust in respect of the whole field of players. It is his/her duty not only to play the game, but to see that their partner and fellow competitors play the game in accordance with the Rules of Golf (and Local Rules), that the scores are correctly marked, and that the Etiquette of Golf is observed.

All members must check their handicap, and mark same on the scorecard before playing in competitions, as an incorrectly marked card could mean disqualification. Rules must be read and understood, as a breach of rules may also mean disqualification.

Rule 6-1, "The player and his caddie are responsible for knowing the Rules."

2.1 CLUB COMPETITIONS

All Club competitions will be administered by the Match Committee. The Match Committee reserves the right to refuse the entry of any player to any competition they are conducting. The Match Committee reserves the right to alter printed programmes if required. Changes will be posted on the "WEEKLY EVENTS BOARD" and "LOCAL RULES BOARD" where possible.

All competitions are to be played in groups of four (4) where possible. At no time will golfers play in group of six (6) or greater during club competitions (**EXCEPTION** - 3 ball Ambrose and Foursomes competitions).

2.2 GRADES AND DIVISIONS

Men's grades are

A Grade	up to 12
B Grade	13 to 19
C Grade	20 to 36

Men's Divisions, Rosnay Veterans competitions, are

Division 1	up to 20
Division 2	21 to 36

Men's Divisions, other competitions, are

Division 1	up to 15
Division 2	16 to 36

Ladies Divisions are

Division 1	up to 20
Division 2	21 to 45

2.3 MONTHLY MEDAL

The Men's Monthly Medal is to be played in 3 Grades, A, B & C conducted on one Saturday or Sunday per month as determined by the Match Committee.

The Ladies Monthly Medal is to be played in 2 Divisions, 1 & 2 conducted on one Saturday or Sunday per month as determined by the Match Committee.

Monthly medal winners will be eligible for a Gold Medal event to be played at the end of the season.

2.4 COURSE RECORD

The score must be in a stroke competition and the course must be played as the ball lies and off the back plates.

2.5 PRO-AM

All Pro-am events will be conducted jointly by the Match Committee and the PGA.

2.6 SWINGERS

A 'swinger' is a player who is a member of two separate pairs in a four-ball competition. The specific objective of this practice is to avoid having a player in a group of three (3) left without a partner.

On payment by the swinger of an additional fee, as determined from time to time by the match committee, the player nominated as the swinger in the group, being the player of the lowest handicap, will pair with each of the other two players in the group. Neither scorecard is to be marked by the swinger. The additional fee is because the swinger has two (2) chances to win the four-ball event.

2.7 VISITORS IN CLUB COMPETITIONS

Visitors may play in Club competitions subject to the following provisions:

1. Must be a member of a Registered Affiliated Golf Club and not a "virtual" club.
2. Must hold a current GA Australian Handicap
3. Have adequate proof of his/her home club membership and handicap.
4. Must pay the appropriate green fees.
5. May (if tee times permit) play in Monthly Medal or Club Championship events but are not permitted to win a Medal or Trophy.

2.8 TEES

The responsibility for the setting up of tee markers for day's events at Auburn Council Golf Course lies solely with the Golf Course Superintendent or Representative (Green Staff). Members will play from the markers as set out by the green staff, whether during club competitions or whilst playing social rounds.

No player may change the tee markers at any time during their round. All Club Championships and Medal Days will be played off the plates. During Friday competitions players are to commence their round on the 1st Tee (**EXCEPTION** – when permission has been obtained from the Pro Shop Manager or at his/her direction).

The following events are the **ONLY** events to be played off the plates:

1. Men's, Ladies, Junior's, Senior and Veterans Club Championships
2. Men's and Ladies Match Play Championships
3. Men's and Ladies Foursomes Championships (including mixed)
4. Men's and Ladies Monthly Medal and Gold Medal
5. Ladies Auburn Bowl (36 hole 2 ball aggregate event)
6. Men's and Ladies "A" Grade Pennants
7. Men's Rosnay Cup, Shield and Bowl.
8. Ladies Clare Arrow Memorial Trophy

ALL OTHER events conducted by the club are to be played from the day markers set by the Golf Course Superintendent or Representative (Green Staff).

2.9 TEE TIMES

Tee times may be booked subject to the following provisions:

1. Bookings must be made on the computer located at the Clubhouse.
2. Booking sheets will be released 2 weeks before the scheduled competition.
3. Members may place a maximum of four (4) names on the booking sheets for any one (1) competition. Players who are shown in position 1/2 and 3/4 on the computer will play as Four-ball partners. These positions may only be changed by the Starter prior to the commencement of their round.
4. Cancellations must be notified as soon as possible and adjusted on the computer. Or via the pro shop on a weekend or the day of competition.
5. Players are required to register at the Pro Shop and the Starter a minimum of 15 minutes before their scheduled tee time.
6. Players must not tee off before or after their allocated tee time unless so directed by the starter.
7. Tee times are subject to change by Pro Shop manager and will vary throughout the year. During Summer Months members may hit off early in competition rounds due to the excessive heat subject to approval from a member of the Match Committee and agreement by the Pro Shop Manager.
8. Members Friday open day competition players must tee off prior to 12:30pm and start from the 1st tee (see also 2.4 Tees).

2.10 NO SHOWS

Members who make a booking to attend a competition are expected to play in accordance with their booked time. Members who fail to show for their booked tee time on Saturday and Sunday will be noted by the Starter and referred to Match Committee. A warning may be given in the first instance; however disciplinary action will be taken against members who continue to breach this provision.

2.11 COMPETITION PRIZES

1. Members and Visitors will receive a Voucher from Rosnay Golf Club in lieu of trophies.
2. Vouchers must be collected with two (2) months and are valid for six (6) months from the date of event.
3. Winners must have 3 handicap cards registered within the previous 12 months.

4. Visitors are advised that any winning score that is subject to receiving a voucher from Rosnay Golf Club, will require that Visitor to provide evidence of having played three (3) handicap events at their home club in the previous twelve months.
5. On Sponsor's days, vouchers may only be redeemed at the nominated sponsor's place of business.

2.12 TIES

1. Stroke Events

In the event of a tie in all Club Championships (EXCEPT Seniors and Veterans) and the Gold Medal, the result will be decided by an 18 hole play-off.

In the event of a tie in the Rosnay Cup, the result will be decided by a 3 hole play-off.

In the event of a tie in all other club competitions, including Seniors and Veterans Club Championship and Rosnay Shield and Bowl, the result will be determined by the Golf Australia count back system.

2. Match Play Events

In the event of a tie after 18 holes, the match will continue from the 1st hole played until a winner is determined by winning a hole.

2.13 COUNT BACK

For 18 hole scratch, stableford and par events, the best score for the last **9 holes on the card** shall be used; if there is still a tie the **last 6 holes** or if still tied the **last 3 holes**. If a tie still persists then hole by hole from the 18th.

In handicap stroke events, the daily playing handicap or fraction shall be applied i.e. use $\frac{1}{2}$ of the handicap for the last 9 holes; if there is still a tie use $\frac{1}{3}$ of the handicap for the last 6 holes; if there is still a tie use $\frac{1}{6}$ of the handicap of the last 3 holes; if there is still a tie use $\frac{1}{18}$ of the handicap for hole by hole from the 18th hole. Fractions are to be retained.

In 36, 54 or 72 hole events, the 18 hole card for the last round will be used. If still tied, count back as above.

2.14 OPEN VETERANS DAYS

All players must be 55 years of age and over, with a GA Handicap.

2.15 NEW MEMBERS

To obtain a GA handicap, ALL new members must lodge three (3) cards marked by a financial Rosnay member, completed in singles competitions at Rosnay.

2.16 PRIORITY OF THE COURSE

The President and Captain shall have the right of the course in club competitions at any time should they desire to exercise that privilege.

3 CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS

The Club Championship events are:

- Stroke Championships (Men, Ladies and Juniors)
- Match-Play Championships (Men and Ladies)
- Foursomes Championships (Men and Ladies)
- Mixed Foursomes Championship
- Gold Medal (Men and Ladies)

4 CONDITIONS OF PLAY IN COMPETITIONS

Conditions of play for all Club Major Events will be posted in the Club House prior to the event.

4.1 COMPETITION FIELD

If for any reason, the field for any competition comprises less than thirty (30) players, the Match Committee shall determine whether the concept of the competition is to be altered or the competition to be cancelled.

4.2 INTERRUPTION OF PLAY

Players may interrupt their play for refreshments after playing nine (9) holes (maximum six minutes only). During Saturday and Sunday competitions players MUST NOT forfeit their positions in the field prior to playing the 10th hole. Players who forfeit their positions will move to the back of the field. During weekend competitions, on arrival at the 10th tee, if the hole is clear, players must continue, without delay after obtaining refreshments.

4.3 THE STARTER

The Starter, acting on behalf of the Match Committee, will perform all duties laid down by the committee, and shall act with the full authority of the Match Committee. Members who fail to show for their booked tee time may be given a warning for their first “no show”, however disciplinary action will be taken against members who continue to breach this provision. Players not ready to start when called may be sent to the end of the field.

ALL PLAYERS MUST COMPLY WITH THE STARTERS DIRECTIONS.

4.4 SCORECARD

Attention is drawn to the Rules of Golf governing the correct keeping of scores – Rule 6-6, Section A and B. It is the player's responsibility to see that it is correctly filled in (handicap, membership number and stroke score included), signed by the marker and countersigned by the player. Failure to do so may lead to disqualification. No alteration may be made on a scorecard after the player has handed it in – Rule 6-6C. The scorecard is the final record for determining results in competitions.

Members are required to complete score cards, and record scores on the computer, and place them in the box provided immediately on completion of their round. The day's competition will close fifteen (15) minutes after the last group finishes their round. Cards not placed in the box provided will not be counted for any trophy.

Competitor's must remain with the same partner and in the same group selected prior to the commencement of play or arranged by the Starter, unless the Match Committee authorizes or ratifies a change – Penalty Disqualification Rule 6.3b (See also By-Law 3.5 Tee Times above).

Cards must be completed at the end of the round and prior to entering the Clubhouse.

4.5 PLAY OFFS

All tied Club Championship events;

- 72 Hole Men's and Ladies Stroke,
- 18 Hole Men's and Ladies Gold Medal,
- 36 Hole Men's and Ladies Foursomes,
- 36 Hole Mixed Foursomes, and
- 36 Hole 4BBB Championship

will be decided by an 18-hole play-off. At the completion of the 18 holes, if players are still tied, the players who are still tied will continue from the 1st hole with sudden death applying until there is a winner.

The Rosnay Cup, if tied, will be decided by a 3 hole play-off consisting of holes 10, 11 and 12. At the completion of the 3 holes, if players are still tied, the players who are still tied will continue on holes 10, 11 and 12 with sudden death applying until there is a winner.

4.6 GOLF ETIQUETTE

Golf is a game of honour and each competitor holds a position of trust in respect of the whole field of players. It is his/her duty not only to play the game, but to see that their partner and fellow competitors play the game in accordance with the Rules of Golf (and Local Rules), that the scores are correctly marked and that the Etiquette of Golf is observed.

A set of practices designed to make the game of golf safer and more enjoyable for golfers and to minimize possible damage to golf equipment and courses are:

Rules – All golfers should carry a copy of the Rules of Golf in their bag and not be afraid to consult the book when situations arise. It is not against the rules of golf to consult the rules or seek advice from other players on the rules.

Fairway divots - Divots are part of the game, and should always be repaired to keep the game enjoyable for all those playing the course. A golfer should have a bucket of sand used for repairing divots.

Walking - Golfers should walk quickly but lightly during play, but remain stationary while others play their shots.

Golf carts - The cart should be parked on the cart path when at the tee or putting green. Carts should not be driven across tee or putting green. Golfers should keep the noise of backing up to a minimum and must always set the park brake when leaving the cart. Moderate speed should be maintained when driving a golf cart. Drivers should remain alert for other people or structures, and should observe signs or lines indicating areas that are not to be crossed by a golf cart.

Honour - The player with the best score on the previous hole has the honour of teeing off first. Playing out of turn is considered ill-mannered and runs counter to the spirit and history of the game. If there is no outright winner of a hole, then the order of play does not change from the previous tee. In informal games, one can play ready golf and not wait for the best score on the hole to tee it up first. Also to speed up play, drop off your partner when riding in a cart then go to your ball.

Ball identification - A golfer should always know which brand of ball they are using to avoid confusion during play. It can also help to mark it to make it easier to distinguish your ball. Many players draw a black line on the ball to help with alignment but if you want to be able to confidently identify a ball as yours, you should draw a personal mark in addition to the black line. Since a player is permitted to mark and lift their ball to identify it, you should do so whenever part of the ball is obscured (deep rough, sand, leaves, etc.). It only takes a few seconds, and can save a world of troubles later on.

Line of sight - Golfers should never take practice swings when other people are nearby to avoid hitting them with the club or with flying rocks or grass. Golfers should accept bad shots calmly, in practice or actual play, and should avoid inappropriate language or the throwing of golf clubs. A golfer should make sure that no one is behind them, or in the path of the swing.

Pitch marks on the green - When golfers arrive at the green, they should make a point to find the pitch mark that has been created by their ball and repair it.

Putting lines - Golfers should note each player's putting line, and avoid stepping on it as they play on the green. A golfer should walk around the line of putt or step over them. A golfer should not stand in the line of sight either ahead or behind a player who is attempting to putt.

Line of play - A golfer must not make a stroke with their caddy, partner or partner's caddy positioned on or close to the line of play or line of putt behind the ball. (Rule 14-2 b)

Bunkers - A player should always enter and leave a bunker from the low side. After the shot, a player should rake the sand smooth again to leave a fresh surface for other players. The rake should be replaced along the sand edge of the bunker.

Silence - Speaking among golfers should be conducted in as low a tone of voice as possible. Golfers should refrain from talking to other players when they are about to hit the ball.

Buggies – should not be parked in front of the green while putting, but left on the side of the green closer to the next tee.

4.7 GREEN FEES

Green fees are payable at the pro shop.

NOTE: Green fees may be altered from time to time for the purpose of running Major Events or at any other time as approved by the Board of Directors.

4.8 LOCAL RULES

Members should make a habit of checking the Notices on the Board before play each day to make sure of any deletions or additions to temporary local rules, etc. Also, take note of local rules on the back of the score card.

4.9 DRESS REGULATIONS

Players are required to be attired in a neat and tidy manner at all times.

The following dress is required for admittance to the golf course:

1. Golf shoes (no metal spikes) or other footwear that completely encloses the foot.
2. Tailored/neat shorts or pants or neat and tidy casual wear.
3. A collared or acceptable golf shirt –t-shirts, offensive prints, text or numbers are not permitted.

5 PENNANT AND INDIVIDUAL REPRESENTATION POLICY

The Match Committee is responsible for the selection of all Pennant and individual golfing representatives of the Rosnay Golf Club.

5.1 PENNANT SELECTION

At appropriate times, the Match Committee will call for expressions of interest from members for Pennant selection.

The expression of interest can be by:

1. Notice on Match Committee Notice Board; or
2. By personal contact from Captain or delegated Match Committee member. This contact can be by phone or personal interview.

5.2 ELIGIBILITY FOR PENNANTS SELECTION

To be eligible for selection in a pennants team, a player must

1. be a financial Golfing Member of the Rosnay Golf Club,
2. have played a minimum of five (5) competition games at Rosnay in the previous three (3) months, and
3. meet the guidelines set down by the governing body controlling the event, as mentioned in the "Rules & Conditions of Play".

5.3 SELECTION REQUIREMENTS

The majority of pennant events conducted in the Sydney Metropolitan area are played in a Match Play format, with all events being conducted separately and having their own "Conditions of Play". When selecting Pennant Teams to represent the Club, the Match Committee should consider the following:

1. The "Conditions of Play" of the competition to be conducted,
2. The player's knowledge of the rules of match play golf,
3. The player's ability to play match play golf,
4. The player's current form,
5. The player's past form/history in match play events, and
6. The player's ability to compete in a team environment

5.4 INDIVIDUAL CLUB REPRESENTATION

Players to represent the club as individuals are to be selected by the Match Committee.

6 HANDICAPPING

All competitions played by the Rosnay Golf Club will be conducted under the guidelines set down by Golf Australia.

The Board of Directors, on recommendation from the Match Committee, may from time to time approve the alteration of a member's handicap, if in its absolute discretion and having regard to all of the circumstances including the member's results in any form of competition, it considers that the change is warranted under the handicap system as used by the Club. The Club will consult with Golf NSW if they feel that action should be taken under "Section 15 of the GA Handicap System."

7 JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT

The Club Captain and/or Match Committee are responsible for:

1. The design and implementation of programmes to foster and encourage the development of junior golfers,
2. The conduct, promotion and administration of junior golfing events, and
3. The selection and management of junior Pennant or other representative teams.

Juniors are not permitted to be in charge of or drive Golf Carts at anytime.

No more than two (2) juniors shall play together in the same group of four, unless accompanied by the Club Captain, a member of the Match Committee or a member approved by the Club Captain.

8 DISPUTES AND PROTESTS

The following procedures are referenced from the Rules of Golf and the Golf NSW Club Management Manual.

1. The Match Committee has the right to alter or make any variations to the Conditions of Play or Programme should they deem it necessary.
2. The Match Committee has the right to refuse the entry of any person into a club competition without being required to give any reason to such refusal.
3. In the absence of a referee, any dispute or doubtful point on the Rules must be referred to the Committee, whose decision is final. If the Committee cannot come to a decision, it may refer the dispute or doubtful point to the Rules of Golf Committee of the R&A (GolfNSW), whose decision is final (Rule 34-3).
4. If any point in dispute is not covered by the Rules, the decision should be made in accordance with equity (Rule 1-4).
5. The Committee has no power to waive a Rule of Golf (Rule 33-1).
6. Protests must be made in writing and submitted to the Match Committee within fifteen (15) minutes of the conclusion of the day's play.

9 LOCAL RULES

As provided in Rule 33-8a, the Match Committee may make and publish Local Rules for local abnormal conditions, if they are consistent with the policy established in the “Rules of Golf – Appendix 1 Part A.” If local abnormal conditions interfere with the proper playing of the game, and the Match Committee considers it necessary to modify a Rule of Golf, authorisation from the R&A must be obtained.

Local Rules are to be displayed in the club house and on the event day board, as near as possible to the date of competition.

- The Ladies Foursomes Championship is to be played in 2 Divisions, 1 & 2.
Division 1: to ____; Division 2: ____ to 45
- The Match Committee may alter the handicap range of the Men's Grades and the Ladies Divisions for the Foursomes Championship depending on the number of players for each Grade or Division.
- On each day, the Championship is to be played in groups of three (3) pairs. On the Saturday, the day's event is to follow the championship field. On the Sunday, the championship field is to start off the 1st tee and the day's event is to start off the 10th tee.

ELIGIBILITY

- Competing players must be full playing financial members of Rosnay Golf Club, have an Australian Golf Handicap and have played three (3) handicap events as a golfing member of the Rosnay Golf Club in the 12 months prior to the championships. It is the player's responsibility to make sure that they are eligible for the Championship event.

PLAY

- Both rounds are to be played off the plates and the ball played as it lies.
- The player that tees off on the odd numbered holes on the first round will tee off on the even numbered holes on the second round and vice versa.

HANDICAPS

- The Match Committee may alter the handicap range of the Divisions for the Mixed Foursomes Championship depending on the number of players for each Division. Also, divisions may be further altered at the completion of the first round, dependent on the size of the field that played in round one.
- On each day, the Championship is to be played in groups of three (3) pairs. On the Saturday, the day's event is to follow the championship field. On the Sunday, the championship field is to start off the 1st tee and the day's event is to start off 10th tee.

ELIGIBILITY

- Competing players must be full playing financial members of Rosnay Golf Club, have an Australian Golf Handicap and have played three (3) handicap events as a golfing member of the Rosnay Golf Club in the 12 months prior to the championships. It is the player's responsibility to make sure that they are eligible for the Championship event.

PLAY

- Both rounds are to be played off the plates and the ball played as it lies.
- Men are to tee off on the odd numbered holes on the first round and the Ladies to tee off on the odd numbered holes on the second round.

HANDICAPS

- Each players Daily Playing Handicap on the first day of the Championship will be used to calculate their Team Handicap for the Championship. The Team Handicap is half of the combined handicap and fractions are to be used in the nett events.

- Any protests are to be delivered, in writing, to a member of the Match Committee, within fifteen (15) minutes after the completion of the day's competition.

GOLD MEDAL - MEN'S AND LADIES

GENERAL

- The Men's Gold Medal is to be played in 3 Grades, A, B & C over 18 holes.
A Grade: to ____; B Grade: ____ to ____; C Grade: ____ to 36
- The Ladies Gold Medal is to be played in 2 Divisions, 1 & 2 over 18 holes.
Division 1: to ____; Division 2: ____ to 45
- The Gold Medal events will be held at the end of the season on a day determined by the Match Committee.

ELIGIBILITY

- Competing players must have won a monthly medal during the season and will compete for the Gold Medal in all Grades or Divisions in which they won a Monthly Medal.
Therefore, a player may win more than one (1) Gold Medal.

PLAY

- The Gold Medal round is to be played off the plates and the ball played as it lies.

HANDICAPS

- Competing players will play off their Daily Playing Handicap current on that day.

CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHIES

- **MEN'S GOLD MEDAL**
Nett winners in three (3) Grades.
- **LADIES GOLD MEDAL**
Nett winners in two (2) Divisions.

TIED SCORES

- In the event of a tie in the Gold Medal Events, the result will be decided by an 18 hole play-off. At the completion of the 18 holes, if players are still tied, the players who are still tied will continue from the 1st hole with sudden death applying until there is a winner. As this a nett event, the stroke index will be used in sudden death.

PROTESTS

- Any protests are to be delivered, in writing, to a member of the Match Committee, within fifteen (15) minutes after the completion of the day's competition.

ROSNAY CUP

GENERAL

- The Rosnay Cup is an open A Grade single stroke event played over 18 holes.

ELIGIBILITY

- Competing players must have an Australian Golf Handicap and be a financial member of their golf club. It is the player's responsibility to make sure that they are eligible for the event.

PLAY

- The event is to be played off the plates and the ball played as it lies.
- All players must have their current Daily Playing Handicap shown on their scorecards prior to the commencement of the event.

HANDICAPS

- Whilst the Rosnay Cup is an A Grade event, Rosnay members with a Daily Playing Handicap greater than 12 may compete however they must play off a handicap of 12.
- Visiting entrants must have maximum Golf Australia Handicap of 11.2 which will give a Daily Playing Handicap of 10 for the event.

- In the event of a tie in the Nett event, the result will be determined by the Golf Australia count back system.

- Any protests are to be delivered, in writing, to a member of the Match Committee, within fifteen (15) minutes after the completion of the event.

ROSNAY SHIELD AND BOWL

GENERAL

- The Rosnay Shield is an open B Grade single stroke event played over 18 holes.
- The Rosnay Bowl is an open C Grade single stroke event played over 18 holes.

ELIGIBILITY

- Competing players must have an Australian Golf Handicap and be a financial member of their golf club. It is the player's responsibility to make sure that they are eligible for the event.

PLAY

- The event is to be played off the plates and the ball played as it lies.
- All players must have their current Daily Playing Handicap shown on their scorecards prior to the commencement of the event.

HANDICAPS

- **Rosnay Members**
Rosnay Shield, Daily Playing Handicap of 13 to 19.
Rosnay Bowl, Daily Playing Handicap of 20 to 36.
- **Visitors**
Rosnay Shield, Golf Australia Handicap of 13.5 to 20.9 which will give a Daily Playing Handicap of 13 to 19.
Rosnay Bowl, Golf Australia Handicap of 21.0 to 29.5 which will give a Daily Playing Handicap of 20 to 27.

- The Auburn Bowl is a Ladies closed 36 hole 4 Ball Aggregate Stroke event played over two (2) consecutive Sundays.

ELIGIBILITY

- Competing players must be full playing financial members of Rosnay Golf Club, have an Australian Golf Handicap and have played three (3) handicap events as a golfing member of the Rosnay Golf Club in the 12 months prior to the championships. It is the player's responsibility to make sure that they are eligible for the Championship event.

PLAY

- The event is to be played off the plates and the ball played as it lies.
- All players must have their current Daily Playing Handicap shown on their scorecards prior to the commencement of each day's play.

HANDICAPS

- Competing players will play off their Daily Playing Handicap current on each day of the event.

TROPHIES

- Nett 4Ball aggregate winners.

DAY'S EVENT

- Nett singles winners in two (2) Divisions, no scratch.

TIED SCORES

- In the event of a tie in either the Auburn Bowl or the day's events, the result will be determined by the Golf Australia count back system.

PROTESTS

- Any protests are to be delivered, in writing, to a member of the Match Committee, within fifteen (15) minutes after the completion of the event.

CLARE ARROW MEMORIAL TROPHY

GENERAL

- The Clare Arrow Memorial Trophy day is an open Ladies single stableford event played over 18 holes with the Clare Arrow Memorial Trophy for Rosnay Ladies only.

ELIGIBILITY

- Competing players must have an Australian Golf Handicap and be a financial member of their golf club. It is the player's responsibility to make sure that they are eligible for the event.

PLAY

- The event is to be played off the plates and the ball played as it lies.
- All players must have their current Daily Playing Handicap shown on their scorecards prior to the commencement of the event.

HANDICAPS

- Competing players will play off their Daily Playing Handicap current on the day.

LOCAL RULES

- Local rules are printed on the back of the score card and any additions or changes are displayed on the Local Rules Board.

TROPHIES

- **Clare Arrow Memorial Trophy, Rosnay Ladies only,**
Nett winner.
- Nett winners in two (2) Divisions.
- Scratch winner. Nett winners are ineligible for scratch.
- Long drive in two (2) Divisions.
- Nearest the Pin in two (2) Divisions.

TIED SCORES

- In the event of a tie in any of the day's events, the result will be determined by the Golf Australia count back system.

PROTESTS

- Any protests are to be delivered, in writing, to a member of the Match Committee, within fifteen (15) minutes after the completion of the event.

AMBROSE COMPETITION

GENERAL

- An Ambrose event can be made up of teams of 2, 3 or 4 persons. Whilst no formal rules apply to an Ambrose event, the following format/rules apply at Rosnay Golf Club.
- The Captain of the team shall be the lowest handicap player.
- For 2 person Ambrose, at least six (6) tee shots from each team member is to be used.
- For 3 person Ambrose, at least four (4) tee shots from each team member is to be used.
- For 4 person Ambrose, at least three (3) tee shots from each team member is to be used.

HANDICAPS

- For two (2) person Ambrose, the Team Handicap is $\frac{1}{4}$ of the combined Daily Playing Handicap.
- For three (3) person Ambrose, the Team Handicap is $\frac{1}{6}$ of the combined Daily Playing Handicap.
- For four (4) person Ambrose, the Team Handicap is $\frac{1}{8}$ of the combined Daily Playing Handicap.

PLAY

- The event is to be played off the markers of the day.
- On every hole, each member of the team may hit a tee shot. The Captain then selects one of the tee shots from which to play. All members of the team may then hit from that position. This procedure is repeated until the ball is holed.
- The position of the selected shot is marked.
- Each team member may then **place** their ball within one club length of the marked position, no nearer the hole, and play from this position.
- If the selected shot is on the fairway, the fringe of the green or in a hazard, bunker or rough, the ball must be **placed** within one (1) club length of the selected, no nearer the hole, and must remain on the fairway, the fringe of the green or in the hazard, bunker or rough. In a sand bunker, the sand may be raked prior to any ball being placed.
- On the Putting Green, the position of the selected putt is marked. Other team members may then place their ball within one putter head length of the marked position, no nearer the hole and putt from this position. Team members may stand behind one another while hitting a shot or on an extension of line when putting.
- To save time, "tap-ins" are encouraged and those who have not putted can still putt to attempt to improve the score.

SCORECARD

- The scorecard must show each team member's handicap and the Team Handicap. The scorecard is to be signed by the Captain and countersigned by one other team member.

TIED SCORES

- In the event of a tie, the result will be determined by the Golf Australia count back system.

PROTESTS

- Any protests are to be delivered, in writing, to a member of the Match Committee, within fifteen (15) minutes after the completion of the event.
